Women who experience partner violence are more likely to develop cervical cancer compared to women without such victimization history. In this community-engaged research project, I am collaborating with relevant stakeholders to develop and test web-based intervention modules to increase cervical health literacy among survivors of partner violence. Then, using a pre-experimental pretest posttest design, I will assess the impact of the modules among survivors of partner violence (N=40). This proposal reflects a continuation of my current research funded by the American Cancer Society (ACS) in which I am piloting a face-to-face, psychosocial behavioral health intervention to improve the cervical health of survivors of partner violence in Kansas and Greater Kansas City. Preliminary results indicate high acceptability of intervention activities and positive trends for women's cervical health; yet, trends also indicate a need to expand the reach of the intervention to younger women and women in rural areas. The development of web-based intervention modules responds to this need.
